The "I AM" is the shepherd of the sheep, the protector of the weak, the provider for those in need, the "rest" for the weary, and the "high tower" for those in need of safety. He really is ALL WE NEED!

He is also our strength in time of temptation. If the devil left Jesus after the great temptation, it certainly was not because he was defeated. He promised to return at a more opportune time.

The enemy walks about as a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour. His mission is to deceive and destroy.

You may have seen the video where the male gazelles are "locked horns" competing for supremacy with the herd. They are fighting each other. He knows that this is a free meal because the gazelles are totally oblivious to his presence because they are fighting each other.
